Introduction

Andantino

Slant 1 over frets 17 on the first string and 18 on the second string to cover both notes for artificial harmonics.

*** Incliner le doigt 1 sur la case 17 de la deuxième corde et 18 sur la troisième pour couvrir les deux harmoniques artificielles.

Slant 1 over frets 17 on the second string and 18 on the third string to cover both notes for artificial harmonics.
