Hints & Tips: In this piece, the left hand plays chords all the way through. Make sure your fingers press the keys exactly together, so all the notes sound at the same time.

Reaching No. 1 in 31 countries, 'Back For Good' was first performed by Take That at the BRIT Awards in 1995, an unveiling that created so much demand for the single that it was made available to the media an unprecedented six weeks before release.

Hints & Tips: The one-note ascending pattern in the left hand is varied occasionally, as in bar 4; you will need to be ready and change your hand position quickly.

Written by Christopher Ward and David Tyson, the inspiration for the song came from a journey Ward took on a bus filled with Elvis Presley fans riding to Memphis to attend the 10th anniversary vigil of The King's death at Graceland. The song is in fact a commemorative story about Elvis, with the first and second verses covering the start of his life and the height of his career, while the bridge references his death:

"In a flash he was gone. It happened so soon. What could you do?"

Hints & Tips: Pay attention to the left hand fingering, especially at the start where the thumb tucks under.
