In essence this is a straightforward piece. It relies on cleanly struck notes and careful attention to LH finger placement. There are two basic elements in this piece: the melody, denoted by upward stems; and the accompaniment, denoted by downward stems. This is a common style of notation, frequently used in guitar writing, to help clarify the composer's musical intentions. Bring out the melody, keeping the accompaniment at a slightly lower dynamic. Make sure that notes are given their full time values. Be particularly careful in bars with accompaniment notes (e.g. bars 2 & 4) not to choke the melody note when playing the lower notes. The player should aim for an overall smoothness and a good sense of direction in the music.
