## INTRODUCTION

As is shown in the new *Thematic Catalogue*, since Nicolò Paganini's solo violin works make up a corpus in their own right, they represent a particularly significant aspect of his musical output.

This part of his output, with the 24 Capricci op. 1 published by Ricordi in 1820 at its core, is made up of compositions that vary widely in terms of character and structure, and were written during different periods of his life. They include Inno patriottico, Tema variato and Sonata a violin solo, composed during his juvenile period (probably before 1805);2 a further Sonata a violino solo (also known as Merveille de Paganini), conceived during his Lucca period (1805-1809) and dedicated to Princess Elisa Baciocchi; and some other pieces that belong to later periods, such as Capriccio a violino solo su "In cor più non mi sento" from 1821; another Capriccio per violino solo, a singular work notated across four staves, written in Vienna in 1828; the variations on God Save The King from 1829 and Caprice d'adieu from 1833. As far as the short Valtz in A major is concerned, given its musical characteristics, we can reasonably rule out its being a composition for solo violin: the piece, recently published,3 corresponds to the violin part from the Valzer no. 2 from Paganini's Divertimenti carnevaleschi M.S. 4.4 The fact that it is found in a

collection of compositions for guitar further leads to the hypothesis that the author intended to write a version for violin and guitar for which only the violin part remains. The inventory of works for solo violin according to the TC reads:

In substance, besides the 24 Capricci—no doubt the most important as well as the most studied and performed works of this group—and a few other compositions, his other works for solo violin have not generated any particular interest on the part of scholars (and performers) of the great violinist's music, to the detriment of a group of pieces that deserve greater consideration for their originality and distinctive characteristics. Amongst these, Sonata a violino solo M.S. 6 (Merveille de Paganini), Caprice d'adieu M.S. 68, and Capriccio a violino solo su "In cor più non mi sento" (M.S. 44), the three of which recently came out in a critical edition curated by me.6

As mentioned earlier, the Tema variato for solo violin is a piece that belongs to the Genoese composer's juvenile period: according to the musicologist Edward Neill, it was composed between the end
