

Canadian singer/songwriter Leonard Cohen recorded "Hallelujah" in 1984. His record company refused to release it as a single, but it was included on his *Various Positions* LP. A few years later, Bob Dylan began performing it in concerts. John Cale recorded it in 1991, and his version was included in the 2001 movie *Shrek*, garnering a huge audience for the song. Jeff Buckley's 1994 version received critical acclaim, but did not become a hit until 2007, ten years after his untimely death. Rufus Wainwright's later cover further popularized "Hallelujah," and to date it has been covered by over 300 artists and has been included in the soundtracks of many movies and TV shows. (Cohen stated he wrote over 80 verses for the song initially, and there are many alternate verses penned by other performers.)





Shallow

Lady Gaga and three other notable rock/pop performers/songwriters (Andrew Wyatt, Anthony Rossomando, and Mark Ronson) composed "Shallow," the Academy Award-winning song featured three times in the 2018's A Star Is Born. The references to water and diving came about because the original script had Bradley Cooper's character drown, as James Mason did in a 1954 incarnation of the film. There have been four Star Is Born movies, all of which tell a similar story. The most dramatic version of "Shallow," when Gaga's character first performs for a huge audience, was filmed live at the Greek Theatre in Los Angeles before several thousand adoring Gaga fans.
